

# “Agilis joins the fight against breast cancer at Race for the Cure”

On Saturday January 28th, 2012, Agilis took part in the Susan G. Komen South Florida Race for the Cure in West Palm Beach. According to the Palm Beach Post, “An estimated 20,000 people participated in the race, organizers said. The event was expected to raise more than \$2 million to fight breast cancer with events ranging from competitive 5K runs to noncompetitive walks to short dashes for toddlers.”<sup>1</sup>

The Agilis team raised **\$1,315.00**,<sup>2</sup> which will go towards funding local breast health education, screening and treatment programs, and national research. Agilis felt that participating in the Susan G. Komen Race for Cure was an opportunity for Agilis to give back to the community that it has been a part of since 1993. Up to 75 percent of net proceeds generated by the Affiliate stays in the South Florida area. The remaining income goes to the national Susan G. Komen for the Cure Grants Program to fund research.
